

Alpha Dog Outdoors

Working Guidelines

The following guidelines have been put together to inform both guide and hunter of some basic rules that “**Alpha Dog Outdoors**” operate under. If there are any questions, please feel free to ask. Good luck and have fun!

- Evidence of the sex must be left on the meat and hide of the animal.
- No loaded weapons in camp, in a vehicle or on a horse.
- A round may be chambered only when the guide gives the okay.
- Guide must have the final say before the hunter shoots.
- Two hunters per guide unless the hunt is a specified ‘one on one’.
- Guide and hunter must remain within sight and sound of each other.
- If a hunter is to be left alone while hunting, the guide must disarm him.
- A guide can help put a wounded animal down only if it is necessary.
- Never leave camp without your licenses and tags.
- Immediately after the animal is down, the hunter tag must be cut.
- Photos are an important part of the hunt.
- Meat is important! It should be brought back to the lodge A.S.A.P.
- DO NOT have, in your procession, any bear part separate from the carcass (i.e.: gall bladder, penis or paws)
- An un-recovered, wounded animal is a dead one! Hunting for that species is over.
- The wolf tag is meant to be hunted while hunting the primary, after the primary tag is cut the wolf hunt can continue for an additional fee.
